PROPOSED AMENDMENT TO THE THORNTON HEATH CONTROLLED PARKING SUB-ZONE IN NURSERY ROAD, ZION PLACE AND ZION ROAD, THORNTON HEATH

1. NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that Croydon Council propose to make a Traffic Order under the relevant sections of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as amended by the Traffic Management Act 2004 and all other enabling powers.
2. **The general effect of the Order would be to amend the Croydon (Thornton Heath) Controlled Parking Sub-Zone to remove 4 'shared use/pay and display' parking bays in Zion Road (outside and opposite Nos. 37 to 41 Zion Road) and to designate new 'shared use/pay and display' parking bays in Nursery Road (1 bay, outside Nos. 36 and 37 Nursery Road) and Zion Place, (2 bays, adjacent to No. 351 Whitehorse Road and adjacent to No. 73 Zion Road). Charges for parking in the bays will vary from 40p for 15 minutes to £1.50 for 2 hours (maximum).**
3. Copies of the proposed Order and of all related Orders, of the Council's statement of reasons for proposing to make the Order and of the plans which indicate each length of road to which the Order relates, can be inspected during normal office hours on Mondays to Fridays inclusive until the last day of a period of six weeks beginning with the date on which the Order was made or, as the case may be, the Council decides not to make the Order, at the Enquiry Counter, 'One-Stop' Facility, Ground Floor, Taberner House, Park Lane, Croydon, Surrey.

Persons desiring to object to the proposed Order should send a statement in writing of their objection and the grounds thereof to the Order Making Section, Parking Services, Community Services Department, 9th Floor, South West Side, Taberner House, Park Lane, Croydon, CR9 1EN quoting the reference CS/PS/JGH/7/Z17 by 9 July 2008.
6. The Order is intended to amend the Croydon (Thornton Heath) Controlled Parking Zone to remove parking bays in Zion Road and extend an existing Bus Stand, extra parking bays will be added in Zion Place and Nursery Road. This will increase the capacity of the bus stand and the new bays should reduce the negative effect on parking for local residents.
