The Croydon (Prohibition and Restriction of Stopping, Loading and Waiting) and (Free Parking Places) (No.22) Order 2023

The Croydon (On-Street Charged-For Parking Places) (No.22) Order 2023

- 1. NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that Croydon Council, on 18 September 2023, made the above Traffic Orders under the relevant sections of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as amended, and all other enabling powers.
- 2. The general effect of the Orders will be:
 - a) To introduce "at any time" double yellow line waiting restrictions in the lengths of streets specified in the Schedule to this Notice.
 - b) To update the map-based tiles to the Schedule attached to the above Orders to accurately represent the new arrangements as they exist on site.
- 3. Copies of the Orders, which will come into operation on 25 September 2023, and of all associated Orders can be inspected by appointment with the Parking Design Team from 9am to 4pm on Mondays to Fridays inclusive until the end of six weeks from the date on which the Orders were made, at the "Access Croydon" Facility, 8 Mint Walk, Croydon, CR0 1EA (telephone 020 8726 6000 and ask for Parking Design).

- 5. Any person desiring to question the validity of the Orders or of any provision contained therein on the ground that it is not within the relevant powers of the Road Traffic Regulation Act, 1984 or that any of the relevant requirements thereof or of any relevant regulations made there under have not been complied with in relation to the Orders may, within six weeks of the date on which the Orders were made, make application for the purpose to the High Court.

SCHEDULE

(Introducing double yellow line waiting restrictions "at any time")

Beauchamp Road, Upper Norwood

- The north-east side, from its junction with Grange Road for 10 metres northwestwards.
- The south-west side, from its junction with Grange Road for 5 metres northwestwards.

Colliers Water Lane, Thornton Heath

The north side, from a point 7 metres west to a point 5 metres east of its junction with Maplethorpe Road.

Grange Road, Upper Norwood

The north-west side, from a point 5 metres north-east of its junction with Beauchamp Road to a point 15 metres south-west of its junction with Beauchamp Road.

Hayes Lane, Kenley

The south-east side, for 10 metres either side of its junction with Wheat Knoll.

Hillside Avenue, Purley

- The north-west side, from its junction with Purley Vale for 5 metres south-westwards.
- The south-east side, from its junction with Purley Vale for 6.7 metres southwestwards.

Maplethorpe Road, Thornton Heath

Both sides, from its junction with Colliers Water Lane for 7 metres north-westwards.

Menlo Gardens, Upper Norwood

The north-east and south-east side (adjacent to Nos. 1 to 73 Menlo Gardens) from a point 33 metres south-west of its junction with Beulah Hill to the entrance to the car parking area at the south-eastern end of Menlo Gardens.

Purley Vale, Purley

The south-west side, for 5 metres either side of its junction with Hillside Avenue.

Wheat Knoll, Kenley

Both sides from its junction with Hayes Lane for 10 metres south-eastwards.
