TEMPORARY RESTRICTION OF VEHICULAR TRAFFIC & PARKING

 Croydon Council HEREBY GIVES NOTICE that to facilitate water main replacement works on behalf of Thames Water, they intend to make an Order the effect of which would be to temporarily restrict traffic and parking in the roads listed in paragraph 2 below.

2. Whilst the said work is taking place the roads below will be closed, and parking will be suspended. Parking will also be suspended on Commerce Way.

Alton Road	Entire length of road
Beddington Farm Road	Closed north-westbound (towards Progress Way)
Kemble Road	Entire length of road
Siddons Road	Entire length of road
Trojan Way	Closed south-westbound (towards the entrance to PC World)

3. When the closures are in force, the alternative routes for traffic will be as detailed below.

Waddon Close	Residents' access to be maintained via use of approved Oxford

Waddon Park	Via Purley Way and Alton Road. Access maintained via approved
Avenue	Oxford boards. Also, use of gate at junction of Benson Road and
	Waddon Park Avenue when required.

- 4. The Order will come into operation on 10 April 2025, and it is anticipated that the work will be completed in approximately four months. However, the Order will remain in force for a maximum duration of 18 months to be reintroduced if further work is required.
- 5. These restrictions shall not apply in respect of:
- (a) a vehicle being used to carry out the said work.
- (b) a vehicle being used for fire brigade, ambulance, or police purposes, or the purposes of a statutory undertaker in an emergency, such as the loss of supplies of gas, electricity or water to premises in the area, which necessitates the bringing of vehicles into a section of road to which the order applies.
- (c) anything done with the permission of a police constable in uniform or a Civil Enforcement Officer.
