- 1. Croydon Council HEREBY GIVES NOTICE that to facilitate gas main replacement work by SGN, they intend to make an Order the effect of which would be to temporarily restrict vehicular traffic on the above roads.
- 2. Whilst the said works are taking place the roads/sections of road detailed below will be closed.

- 3. Whilst the closures are in place the diversion routes for traffic will be as detailed below.
- Sundown Avenue via Farm Fields and Sanderstead Hill.
- Sanderstead Hill Northbound via Sanderstead Road, A235 Brighton Road, Purley Road, Godstone Road A23, Downs Court Road, Mitchley Avenue, and Rectory Park.
- Sanderstead Hill Southbound via Addington Road, Selsdon Park Road, Gravel Hill, Coombe Lane, Coombe Road, South End, and Brighton Road.
- Purley Downs Road via A235 Brighton Road, Purley Road, Godstone Road A23, Downs Court Road, Mitchley Avenue, and Rectory Park.
- Purley Oaks Road via St Marys Road and Sanderstead Road.
- 4. The Order will come into operation on 04 August 2025, and it is anticipated that the work will be completed as detailed above. However, the Order will remain in force for 18 months to be reintroduced should further work be required.
- 5. These restrictions shall not apply in respect of:
 - (a) any vehicle involved in carrying out the said works.
 - (b) a vehicle being used for fire brigade, ambulance, or police purposes, or the purposes of a statutory undertaker in an emergency, such as the loss of supplies of gas, electricity or water to premises in the area, which necessitates the bringing of vehicles into a section of road to which the order applies.
 - (c) anything done with the permission of a police constable in uniform or a Civil Enforcement Officer.
