ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT, 1984, SECTION 14

ALTYRE ROAD, CROYDON
NOTICE OF TEMPORARY RESTRICTION OF TRAFFIC & PARKING

1. Croydon Council HEREBY GIVES NOTICE that to facilitate a crane operation to move telecoms equipment to and from a rooftop, they have made an Order the effect of which would be to temporarily restrict traffic and parking in Altyre Road.
2. Whilst the said works are taking place:
 - a) Altyre Road will be closed to vehicular traffic between the public entrance and the northern boundary of Croydon Law Courts.
 - b) Parking bays within the above closure area will be suspended and waiting and loading restrictions will apply at any time.
 - c) The western footway of Altyre Road (outside the courts) will be closed between the public entrance and the northern boundary of Croydon Law Courts.
3. During the closure the alternative route for vehicular traffic will be via Hazledean Road, Addiscombe Grove, Barclay Road, Park Lane Roundabout and vice versa. Pedestrians affected by the footway closure will be directed to the opposite footway.
4. The Order will come into operation on 04 October 2025, and it is anticipated that works will be carried out over three weekends (04 and 05, 11 and 12, and 18 and 19 October 2025) with back-up dates of 25 and 26 October 2025, if the works are delayed. However, the Order will remain in force for 18 months to be reintroduced should further work be required.
5. The restrictions shall not apply in respect of:
 - (a) a vehicle being used for fire brigade, ambulance, or police purposes, or the purposes of a statutory undertaker in an emergency, such as the loss of supplies of gas, electricity or water to premises in the area, which necessitates the bringing of vehicles into a section of road to which the order applies.
 - (b) anything done with the permission of a police constable in uniform or a Civil Enforcement Officer.
 - (c) any vehicle involved in carrying out the specified works.
