The Croydon (Prohibition and Restriction of Stopping, Loading and Waiting) and (Free Parking Places) (No. F50) Order 20-The Croydon (On-Street Charged-For Parking Places) (No. F51) Order 20-

- 1. NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that Croydon Council proposes to make the above Traffic Orders under the relevant sections of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as amended, and all other enabling powers.
- 2. The general effect of the Orders would be to remove 11.5 metres of existing single yellow line marked on the north-east side of Birchanger Road, outside Nos. 5 to 8 The Close, and replace it with a new zebra crossing and zig-zag markings. The crossing and zig-zag markings will be marked on both sides of the road and extend from the south-eastern end of the existing double yellow lines adjacent to the flank wall of Thomas Becket School for 40.6 metres south-eastwards.
- 3. A copy of the proposed Orders and all related documents can be inspected on Monday to Friday inclusive, until the last day of a period of six weeks beginning with the date on which the Orders are made, or the Council decides not to make the Orders, between 10am and 6pm, at Croydon Central Library, Katharine Street, CR9 1ET. Alternatively, all related documents or further information can be requested by email to Parking.Design@croydon.gov.uk.
- 4. Persons desiring to object to the proposed Orders should send a statement in writing of their objection and the grounds thereof to the Order Making Section or email the Parking Design Team (addresses above), quoting the reference PD/CH/F50 & F51 by 08 January 2026.
- 5. The Order is intended to remove existing waiting restrictions on Birchanger Road, South Norwood, to accommodate a new zebra crossing. The changes are part of a scheme to introduce improvements to create a safer environment for pedestrians.
