

**PROPOSED REMOVAL OF DISABLED BAYS AND AMENDMENT OF SCHOOL KEEP CLEAR - MORLAND ROAD, CROYDON – OUTSIDE WOODSIDE SCHOOL**

The Croydon (Prohibition and Restriction of Stopping, Loading and Waiting) and  
(Free Parking Places) (No. F54) Order 20-

The Croydon (On-Street Charged-For Parking Places) (No. F55) Order 20-

1. NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that Croydon Council proposes to make the above Traffic Orders under the relevant sections of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as amended, and all other enabling powers.
2. **The general effect of the Orders would be to make the amendments below to accommodate a new zebra crossing and zig-zag markings, which would extend from the common boundary of Nos. 297 and 299 Morland Road for 40.6 metres eastwards, on both sides of the road.**
  - a) **To remove the two disabled parking bays outside Woodside Primary School.**
  - b) **To shorten the school keep clear marking outside Woodside Primary School to 64 metres and remove the short section of double yellow lines opposite No. 321 Morland Road.**

Note: the single yellow line outside Nos. 321 to 329 Morland Road would be retained, but the white line “access protection marking” outside those properties would be removed.
3. A copy of the proposed Orders and all related documents can be inspected until the last day of a period of six weeks beginning with the date on which the Order was made or, as the case maybe, the Council decides not to make the Order, between 10am and 6pm, at Croydon Central Library, Katharine Street, CR9 1ET. 4. Persons desiring to object to the proposed Orders should send a statement in writing of their objection and the grounds thereof to the Order Making Section, Parking Design Team, Bernard Weatherill House, 8 Mint Walk, Croydon, CR0 1EA or email Parking Design (email address above) quoting the reference PD/CH/F54 & F55 by 08 January 2026.
5. The Order is intended to remove existing disabled bays and amend a school keep clear marking on Morland Road, Croydon, to accommodate a new zebra crossing. The changes are part of a scheme to introduce improvements to create a safer environment for pedestrians.
