PROPOSED REMOVAL OF WAITING RESTRICTIONS - MORLAND ROAD, CROYDON - AT ITS JUNCTION WITH STRETTON ROAD

The Croydon (Prohibition and Restriction of Stopping, Loading and Waiting) and (Free Parking Places) (No. F56) Order 20-The Croydon (On-Street Charged-For Parking Places) (No. F57) Order 20-

- 1. NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that Croydon Council proposes to make the above Traffic Orders under the relevant sections of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as amended, and all other enabling powers.
- 2. The general effect of the Orders would be to make the amendment below to accommodate a new zebra crossing and zig-zag markings, which would extend from the common boundary of Nos. 59 and 61 to the north-eastern boundary of No. 24a Morland Road.
 - To remove the existing single yellow lines on both sides of Morland Road between the common boundary of Nos. 59 and 61 and the north-eastern boundary of No. 24a Morland Road.
- 3. A copy of the proposed Orders and all related documents can be inspected until the last day of a period of six weeks beginning with the date on which the Order was made or, as the case maybe, the Council decides not to make the Order, between 10am and 6pm, at Croydon Central Library, Katharine Street, CR9 1ET. Alternatively, all documents can be obtained by email request to Parking.Design@croydon.gov.uk.
- 4. Persons desiring to object to the proposed Orders should send a statement in writing of their objection and the grounds thereof to the Order Making Section, Parking Design Team, Bernard Weatherill House, 8 Mint Walk, Croydon, CR0 1EA or email Parking Design (email address above) quoting the reference PD/CH/F56 & F57 by 08 January 2026.
- 5. The Order is intended to remove existing waiting restrictions on Morland Road, Croydon, to accommodate a new zebra crossing. The changes are part of a scheme to introduce improvements to create a safer environment for pedestrians.
