ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT, 1984, SECTION 14 AS AMENDED
THE ROAD TRAFFIC (TEMPORARY RESTRICTIONS) ACT 1991
AND ALL OTHER ENABLING POWERS

ELGIN ROAD, CLYDE ROAD & RADCLIFFE ROAD, CROYDON
TEMPORARY PROHIBITION OF VEHICULAR TRAFFIC

1. Croydon Council HEREBY GIVE NOTICE that to facilitate tram replacement works, they have made an Order the effect of which would be to temporarily prohibit traffic movements in Elgin Road, Clyde Road and Radcliffe Road.
2. Whilst the said works are taking place:
 - a) Elgin Road will be closed between its junction with Addiscombe Road and a point 46 metres north of that junction from 08 to 27 February 2026.
 - b) Clyde Road will be closed between its junction with Addiscombe Road and a point 24 metres north of that junction from 10 to 26 February 2026.
 - c) Radcliffe Road will be closed between its junction with Addiscombe Road and a point 24 metres south-east of that junction from 10 to 26 February 2026.
 - d) One-way working in Clyde Road will be suspended from 10 to 26 February 2026.
3. During the works the diversion routes for vehicular traffic will be as detailed below.
 - Radcliffe Road diversion – via Chepstow Road, Park Hill Rise, Deepdene Avenue, Ranmore Avenue, and Radcliffe Road.
 - Elgin Road diversion – via Addiscombe Road, Havelock Road, and Lower Addiscombe Road.
4. The Order will come into operation on 08 February 2026, and it is anticipated that the works will be completed as above. However, the Order will remain in force for 18 months to be reintroduced should further work be required. The prohibitions will only apply during such times and to such extent as shall from time to time be indicated by traffic signs.
5. The restrictions shall not apply in respect of:
 - (a) a vehicle involved in carrying out the said works.
 - (b) a vehicle being used for fire brigade, ambulance, or police purposes, or the purposes of a statutory undertaker in an emergency, such as the loss of supplies of gas, electricity or water to premises in the area, which necessitates the bringing of vehicles into a section of road to which the order applies.
 - (c) anything done with the permission of a police constable in uniform or a Civil Enforcement Officer.
