ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT, 1984, SECTION 14 AS AMENDED  
THE ROAD TRAFFIC (TEMPORARY RESTRICTIONS) ACT 1991  
AND ALL OTHER ENABLING POWERS

HALING ROAD, HALING PARK ROAD & BRIGHTON ROAD, SOUTH CROYDON  
TEMPORARY PROHIBITION OF VEHICULAR TRAFFIC & PARKING

1. Croydon Council HEREBY GIVE NOTICE that to facilitate electrical network reinforcement works on behalf of UKPN, they intend to make an Order the effect of which would be to temporarily prohibit traffic and parking in Haling Road, Haling Park Road and Brighton Road, South Croydon.
2. Whilst the said works are taking place:
  - a) Haling Road will be closed at its junctions with Brighton Road (one junction at a time) from 19 March 2026 for approximately 14 days.
  - b) Haling Park Road will be closed at its junction with Brighton Road from 01 April 2026 for approximately 14 days.
  - c) Parking in Brighton Road will be suspended and waiting and loading restrictions will apply at any time on both sides between its junctions with Drovers Road and Jarvis Road.
  - d) Parking in Haling Park Road will be suspended outside the sub-station.
3. During the closures, the alternative routes for vehicles will be as detailed below.
  - Haling Park Road closure – via Brighton Road, St Augustine’s Avenue, Avondale Road and vice versa
  - Haling Road closure – use other entrance/exit to Haling Road that is not obstructed.
4. The restrictions shall not apply in respect of:
  - (a) any vehicle involved in conducting the said work.
  - (b) a vehicle being used for fire brigade, ambulance, or police purposes, or the purposes of a statutory undertaker in an emergency, such as the loss of supplies of gas, electricity or water to premises in the area, which necessitates the bringing of vehicles into a section of road to which the order applies.
  - (c) anything done with the permission of a police constable in uniform or a Civil Enforcement Officer.
5. The Order will come into operation on 19 March 2026, and it is anticipated that the works will be carried out as detailed above. However, the Order will remain in force for 18 months to be reintroduced should further work be required. The prohibitions will only apply during such times and to such extent as shall from time to time be indicated by traffic signs.
