ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT, 1984, SECTION 14
AS AMENDED AND THE ROAD TRAFFIC (TEMPORARY RESTRICTIONS) ACT
1991

CHERRY ORCHARD ROAD, CROYDON
TEMPORARY RESTRICTION OF TRAFFIC & PARKING

1. Croydon Council HEREBY GIVES NOTICE that to facilitate footway re-surfacing works, they have made an Order the effect of which would be to temporarily restrict traffic and parking in Cherry Orchard Road, Croydon.
2. Whilst the said works are taking place:
 - a) The north-western (odd-numbered side) footway of Cherry Orchard Road will be closed between its junctions with Lower Addiscombe Road and Leslie Grove.
 - b) The carriageway of Cherry Orchard Road will be closed between its junctions with Lower Addiscombe Road and Leslie Park Road.
 - c) Parking in Cherry Orchard Road will be suspended on both sides of the road between its junction with Lower Addiscombe Road and the common boundary of Nos. 119 and 121 Cherry Orchard Road.
3. Whilst footway closure is in force, pedestrians will be directed to the opposite footway. The alternative routes for vehicular traffic will be as detailed below. Access will be maintained for residents.
 - Via Lower Addiscombe Road, A215 and A232 and reversed.
 - Via Fairfield Road, Altyre Road and Addiscombe Road.
4. The Order will come into operation on 23 March 2026, and it is anticipated that the works will be completed over three nights from 8pm to 5am, finishing on 26 March 2026. However, the order will remain in force for 18 months to be reintroduced should further work be necessary.
5. These restrictions shall not apply in respect of:
 - (a) any vehicle or person involved in conducting the said work.
 - (b) a vehicle being used for fire brigade, ambulance, or police purposes, or the purposes of a statutory undertaker in an emergency, such as the loss of supplies of gas, electricity or water to premises in the area, which necessitates the bringing of vehicles into a section of road to which the order applies.
 - (c) anything done with the permission of a police constable in uniform or a Civil Enforcement Officer.
