ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT, 1984, SECTION 14 AS AMENDED  
THE ROAD TRAFFIC (TEMPORARY RESTRICTIONS) ACT 1991  
AND ALL OTHER ENABLING POWERS  
PURLEY RISE, PURLEY  
TEMPORARY PROHIBITION OF VEHICULAR TRAFFIC

1. Croydon Council HEREBY GIVE NOTICE that to facilitate gas main replacement work, they intend to make an Order the effect of which would be to temporarily prohibit traffic movements on Purley Rise, Purley.
2. Whilst the said work is taking place closures will apply on the following sections of road.

<b>Road to be closed</b>	<b>Extent of closure</b>	<b>Period of closure</b>
Purley Rise	Between its north-eastern junction with Brighton Road (adjacent to No. 36 Brighton Road) and the north-western boundary of No. 48 Purley Rise.	08 June to 15 June 2026
Purley Rise	Between its south-western junction with Brighton Road (adjacent to No. 74 Brighton Road) and its junction with Hill Road.	15 June to 22 June 2026
Purley Rise	Between its junction with Hill Road and No. 3 Purley Rise	22 June to 03 July 2026

3. During the works the diversion route for vehicular traffic will be via Hill Road, Woodcote Valley Road, Purley Knoll, Brighton Road and vice versa.
4. The Order will come into operation on 08 June 2026, and it is anticipated that the works will be completed as detailed above. However, the Order will remain in force for 18 months to be reintroduced should further work be required. The prohibitions will only apply during such times and to such extent as shall from time to time be indicated by traffic signs.
5. The restrictions shall not apply in respect of:
  - (a) a vehicle involved in carrying out the said works.
  - (b) a vehicle being used for fire brigade, ambulance, or police purposes, or the purposes of a statutory undertaker in an emergency, such as the loss of supplies of gas, electricity, or water to premises in the area, which necessitates the bringing of vehicles into a section of road to which the order applies.
  - (c) anything done with the permission of a police constable in uniform or a Civil Enforcement Officer.
