ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT, 1984, SECTION 14 AS AMENDED
THE ROAD TRAFFIC (TEMPORARY RESTRICTIONS) ACT 1991
AND ALL OTHER ENABLING POWERS

STANLEY ROAD & LONDON ROAD, CROYDON
TEMPORARY PROHIBITION OF TRAFFIC

1. Croydon Council HEREBY GIVE NOTICE that to facilitate cable installation work on behalf of UKPN, they intend to make an Order, the effect of which would be to temporarily prohibit traffic movements in Stanley Road and London Road, Croydon.
2. During the work:
 - a) Stanley Road will be closed at its junction with London Road.
 - b) The cycle lane on the west (odd-numbered) side of London Road will be closed between the common boundary of Nos. 433 and 435 London Road and its junction with Stanley Road.
 - c) The footway on the west (odd-numbered) side of London Road will be closed between the common boundary of Nos. 433 and 435 London Road and its junction with Stanley Road.
3. Whilst the closure of Stanley Road remains in force the diversion route for vehicles will be via London Road, Canterbury Road, York Road and Stanley Road. During the cycle lane closure cyclists will be diverted into the main carriageway. Pedestrians affected by the footway closure will be diverted via a walkway in the cycle lane.
4. The Order will come into operation on 24 August 2026, and it is anticipated that the work will be completed on 28 August 2026. However, the Order will remain in force for 18 months to be reintroduced should further work be required. The prohibitions will only apply during such times and to such an extent as shall from time to time be indicated by traffic signs.
5. The restrictions shall not apply in respect of:
 - (a) any vehicle or person involved in conducting the said work.
 - (b) a vehicle being used for fire brigade, ambulance, or police purposes, or the purposes of a statutory undertaker in an emergency, such as the loss of supplies of gas, electricity or water to premises in the area, which necessitates the bringing of vehicles into a section of road to which the order applies.
 - (c) anything done with the permission of a police constable in uniform or a Civil Enforcement Officer.
