ALTYRE ROAD, CROYDON
NOTICE OF TEMPORARY RESTRICTION OF TRAFFIC & PARKING

1. Croydon Council HEREBY GIVES NOTICE that to facilitate a crane operation to move panes of glass to and from Altitude Apartments, Altyre Road, they have made an Order the effect of which would be to temporarily restrict traffic and parking in Altyre Road.
2. Whilst the said works are taking place:
 - a) Altyre Road will be closed to vehicular traffic between its junctions with Hazledean Road and Barclay Road.
 - b) Parking bays in Altyre Road between its junction with Barclay Road and the vehicular entrance to the former Croydon Park Hotel will be suspended and waiting and loading restrictions will apply at any time.
 - c) The eastern footway of Altyre Road (outside Altitude Apartments) will be closed between its junction with Barclay Road and a point 20.5 metres north of that junction.
3. During the closure the alternative routes for vehicular traffic will be as detailed below. Pedestrians affected by the footway closure will be directed to the opposite footway.
 - Via Fairfield Road, Addiscombe Grove, and Hazledean Road.
 - Via Hazledean Road and Addiscombe Road.
 - Via Addiscombe Grove and Hazledean Road.
4. The Order will come into operation on 22 August 2026, and it is anticipated that works will be carried out over two weekends (22 and 23, and 29 and 30 August 2026). However, the Order will remain in force for 18 months to be reintroduced should further work be required.
5. The restrictions shall not apply in respect of:
 - (a) a vehicle being used for fire brigade, ambulance, or police purposes, or the purposes of a statutory undertaker in an emergency, such as the loss of supplies of gas, electricity or water to premises in the area, which necessitates the bringing of vehicles into a section of road to which the order applies.
 - (b) anything done with the permission of a police constable in uniform or a Civil Enforcement Officer.
 - (c) any vehicle or person involved in carrying out the specified works.
