

# BROAD GREEN

## 2018 - 2019 Ward Report

**This report provides a summary of the 2018/19 community ward spend, highlighting some of the outcomes in line the Council’s Corporate Plan commitment and wider approach to a refreshed Community Voluntary Strategy.**

**Summary:**

In 2018/19 a total of £21,136.66 was allocated, with the remaining balance of £3476.68 being carried forward to 2019/2020 spend. Allocation of Funding is analysed under 6 categories – i.e. a) Children & Young People b) Health and Well-being c) Culture Sports & Arts d) Work & Career e) Environment & Leisure. This has been colour coded for ease of reference and the key is provided below.

ACTIVE LIVING SUPPORT	We will be delivering pan-disability multi-sport sessions for 11-18 year olds for 3 weeks. We will be delivering weekly sessions of boxing. EMPOWERING TAMIL FAMILIES	To celebrate the achievements of our community members (in parenting, spoken and written English, AAT courses, sewing) and encourage further growth. To encourage socialising with other communities and organisations for our families.	£500.00
GUIDING HANDS ORGANISATION CIC	The project is essentially to help Mums within the broad Green area We are a local community interest company that has been working in the Broad Green area of Croydon for the past 2 years helping young mums. Our programs are Foodie Friday Young Mums Group, YMNC Young Mums Netball Club.	£250.00
GYE NYAME DEVELOPMENT FOUNDATION	Our project "Keep It Real2" is an infusion of street and African dancing, drumming and drama club. This a free membership and participation service, for young people ranging from the ages of 5 to 13 and supervisory roles from ages 14 – 18	£1,481.67
