Priorities and vision for 2019-2020

To follow up on my speech from annual council I wanted to keep you all updated as to the plans to continue on my priorities for this mayoral term of office.

Domestic Violence – I see within our local communities domestic violence is a big issue, I would like to raise awareness so that victims and their support networks can learn how to report it and what is on offer to them. I am hosting an interagency seminar on the 16th September at the Town Hall.

Mental Health – I am also organising an interagency seminar on mental health. We want to work with communities where it can be hidden in families and try to reduce stigma. This is on the 4^{th} November in the Town Hall.

Safer Croydon – I am identifying young people from the community to look at new ways of approaching the issues associated with knife crime

Local business – my business ambassadors and I will be visiting local businesses across 7 districts in Croydon to highlight what is on offer by the council to help businesses. I will be working on an event for businesses so watch this space.

I am working on all these plans in conjunction with the lead cabinet members, relevant officers and community groups, not to rewrite the wheel but to work together.

About the Mayor – In this newsletter I will share some information about the Mayor's role.

The Mayor must be non-partisan in all that he does and an outline of the duties are set out below:

Council duties

To represent and promote the council as a whole in all civic and ceremonial matters.

To preside over and chair meetings of the Full Council.

The Mayor should encourage fair debate but s/he has the casting vote.

To uphold and promote the purposes of the constitution and to interpret when necessary.

To publicise events of the council and encourage involvement in the council's activities.

To promote the work of the council.

Public duties

To be the first citizen of the borough and the focus of local democracy: to be visible, to listen to and to engage with the community.

To represent the people of the London Borough of Croydon, both within the borough area and externally.

To support voluntary organisations.

Borough duties

To represent the borough.

To promote the borough as a place to live: through appropriate external contacts.

To promote the borough as a place to visit: through external contacts, visits outside of the borough and tourism events.

To promote business in/into the borough: both in terms of existing businesses and potential inward investors.

There is often a misunderstanding of the role of a civic Mayor, unfortunately the Mayor of Croydon is unable to take on any case work outside of their ward. You can find your local councillor by clicking here https://democracy.croydon.gov.uk and selecting councillors.

Invite the Mayor

If you have an event you would like to invite the Mayor to please email themayor@croydon.gov.uk with the name of the event, the organisation, location, timings and what you would require the Mayor to do. If the Mayor is able to attend you will need to complete a proforma and return 2 weeks prior to the event.
