

Norbury Library Update – June 2020



Construction works have resumed at Norbury Library with all contractors adhering to social distancing guidelines, which are being regularly inspected.

Work on the roof is making good progress with all the glazing removed to enable access to the main structure. The scaffolding canopy that is covering the building is also allowing for the cleaning and repointing of the decorative stonework; and extensive work to the guttering and downpipes.

The lift installation is under way, with excavation of the pit almost complete and the new lift lobby being created:



Redecoration to the interior has also begun following extensive repairs to the plasterwork on the walls and ceilings in the main library:

Work on the new floors has started with the initial levelling treatment, shown here in the new quiet study area.
