This report provides a summary of the 2018/19 community ward spend highlighting some of the outcomes in line the Council's Corporate Plan commitment and wider approach to a refreshed Community Voluntary Strategy.

Summary:

In 2018/19 a total of £24000.00 allocated. COMMEMORATION OF SURREY IRON RAILWAY WHICH RAN THROUGH ROTARY FIELD 1805-1837	Commemoration of Surrey Iron Railway which ran through Rotary Field 1805-1838, through commissioning of a life-size model of the railway in cast iron which will be installed during 2019.	£4,000.00
DAVID SHEPHERD, SURREY BEEKEEPERS'	This award is to enable the Association to install some solar lighting and associated equipment at its Hartley Down Apiary. Members will then be able to work on maintenance of the beehives for more hours in the day during the winter, rather than being reliant on daylight.	£1,000.00
EVOLVE HOUSING	The money will help fund a new initiative which is aimed particularly at Croydon & Purley's homeless. This funding is in memory of two homeless men who lived under the Purley Tesco underpass for 10 weeks in 2018.	£1,000.00
PURLEY YOUTH PROJECT	The club offers ways of meeting young people's social, personal and spiritual needs through discussion, informal education and activities in Purley for people living throughout the borough. This funding enables them to organise special events and outings which would otherwise not be possible.	£8,500.00

SOUTH EAST CANCER TRUST	The South East Cancer Help Centre provides services to patient and family members affected by cancer. They provide counselling, bereavement and many other therapies aimed at exploring ways in which individuals can cope with their situation. They also provide a service at CUH.	£3,500.00
THE CHARTWELL CANCER TRUST	To create a new state-of-the-art Oncology Unit within the wider overhaul of Acute Paediatric Services at CUH to give young patients vitally needed upgraded facilities and excellence in care, and enable the borough to meet future demands on children's healthcare.	£3,000.00
THE ROTARY CLUB PURLEY	Purley Rotary Club has organised the annual Swimathon ever since 1988, and each year it raises many thousands of pounds for nominated local charities, which this year are End Polio Now, Purley Food Hub, the Firefighters' Charity.	£3000.00
