

SOUTH NORWOOD

2018 - 2019 Ward Report

This report provides a summary of the 2018/19 community ward spend, highlighting some of the outcomes in line the Council's Corporate Plan commitment and wider approach to a refreshed Community Voluntary Strategy.

Summary:

In 2018/19 a total of £23,760.00 allocated, with the remaining unallocated funds of 240.00 being carried forward to 2019/20 spend. Allocation of Funding is analysed under 6 categories – i.e. a) Children & Young People b) Health and Well-being c) Culture Sports & Arts d) Work & Career e) Environment & Parks. This has been colour coded for ease of reference and the key is provided below.

ALL HEADS RECOGNISED- SERIOUS YOUTH VIOLENCE ENGAGEMENT	Bring families together to discuss the serious youth violence in particular Knife crime.	£1,000.00
CROYDON BICYCLE THEATRE	This event will encourage and inspire a large local audience to understand how effective and important democratic engagement is. It will develop an appreciation of the unique challenges faced by black women, and how their specific efforts have benefited us all.	£350.00
CROYDON BME- KNIFE CRIME EVENT	Due to the challenges in knife crime and the serious wall of silence that the police meet from young people, the aim of this event is to bring cohesion between the Met, the council and the young people. In addition the aim is to have enough services and community groups on hand with literature, information, advice and guidance that young people can benefit from.	£3,000.00

HOLMESDALERESIDENT ASSOCIATION- NEW PLANTERS	Repaired or replaced new planters and new plants in place over coming months. Improve local environment, give the community a stake in area and continue to discourage rubbish dumping.	£200.00
LITTER PICKING FRIENDS OF SOUTH NORWOOD	Litter Picking Friends of SN regularly hold clean up events across South Norwood. This entails carrying litter pickers, brooms, shovels & bags to the site to be cleaned. The filled litter bags then need to be dropped at the designated point for collection by the Council's cage lorry.	£58.99
REACHING HIGHER	The Study Hub is to provide young people with a safe, supervised area in which they can complete assignments, revision, CV's, applications, UCAS Personal Statements and anything they require guidance/assistance with.	£4,000.00
SCREEN25- JAMAICAN INDEPENDENCE DAY	The event has a capacity of 400 and all available tickets have now been allocated. We have taken precautions to ensure that priority is given to local residents, including restricting the number of tickets available online and working with partner venues based in South Norwood to distribute tickets in person. This has also had the double benefit of promoting of local independent businesses and increasing footfall to their premises.	£500.00
SOUTH NORWOOD AND WOODSIDE COMMUNITY ASSOCIATION	For the older people in particular our aim is to provide a service that will keep them out of the care system and in their own homes for as long as we can. A healthy meal, company, outings and visits to the centre all add to keeping the mind and body healthy.	£1,000.00
SOUTH NORWOOD COMMUNITY FESTIVAL	A free festival for everyone in the community.	£3,000.00
SOUTH NORWOOD WOODCRAFT FOLK- CLLR FRASER	First aid training for volunteers working with children on behalf of the South Norwood Woodcraft Folk. The course allows for 12 learners	£345.00
STANLEY PEOPLE'S INITIATIVE	To enable community groups to hire Stanley Halls at rates significantly below standard commercial rates, while not jeopardising the Halls' financial sustainability	£1,500.00
STANLEY PEOPLE'S INITIATIVE	An opportunity for local businesses to showcase themselves and to offer a work experience and personal development programme for some young people in the area	£4,736.01
SUNNY BANK/REGINA RD FUN DAY	Community fun day for residents of Regina Road/Sunnybank and South Norwood.	£70.00

WHITE HUT STUDIOS	We are seeking £4000 to hold 10 sessions at the Samuel Coleridge Taylor Centre. There will be Mentoring and Music programmes for the young people with a celebration performance in front of peers and parents, with special guests, closing with the presentation of achievement certificates.	£4,000.00
