

Subject title: Tackling unwanted sexual behaviour on the transport network

Since April last year, Transport for London in collaboration with London's Policing agencies has been running a campaign called 'Report it to stop it'.

'Report it to stop it' encourages anyone who has experienced unwanted sexual behaviour on the transport network to report it to the police. Too often, victims do not realise that any behaviour that makes them feel uncomfortable, such as groping, masturbation, flashing, leering, following and sexual comments, can be reported, and will be investigated.

There have been increased reports of over 30% within the first nine months of the campaign, and 40% more arrests which demonstrates that reporting can lead to apprehending those who undertake these abhorrent crimes.

We are continuing our work to make the transport network free from all unwanted sexual behaviour and need your help to create further awareness and reassure victims that if they report it, it will be taken seriously and investigated. We are really keen for all young people in London to know that:

- Unwanted sexual behaviour on public transport is never ok
- You can report anything that makes you feel uncomfortable
- We will always take you seriously
- Report it to stop it
